Hopeful Futures and the Future of SWCRS – A Cross-Disciplinary Community Conversation

This year, the leadership of SWCRS, AAR, and SSBS come together to offer a joint plenary. In light of the evolving challenges of the pandemic and growing concerns with an unstable economy, the work of imagining hopeful futures is as urgent as ever. The recent decision by the national leadership of the Society of Biblical Literature to eliminate support for regional meetings is evidence of the reality of these challenges.

This year's plenary leads with the intention of nurturing the future of SWCRS to grow and solidify its diverse scholarly community. We will connect the annual theme of "Hopeful Futures" to broader issues of diversity, equity, inclusion, and belonging concerning the future and viability of SWCRS. Through vital conversation with the officers of other SWCRS organizations as well as with the regional community at large, this session will develop a roadmap as we seek to reimagine pathways forward toward flourishing futures. With multiple, and potentially conflicting, visions

of what may 'count' for a "hopeful future," this plenary aims to generate discussion both nuanced and robust.

To begin, SWCRS leadership will outline the structure of the organization and how it works. Leaders from SSBS will briefly describe the discussions that resulted in SBL eliminating regional meetings. There will be small and large discussions around issues concerning the future of our guild and our field(s). A series of questions will be posed to stimulate discussion and to collect data for planning future meetings.


